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About the Youth Entrepreneurship Program

It is a training programme for curious minds to learn about business opportunities in food and health and provide them with the knowledge and tools to validate business ideas in both sectors. The Program will take place in October and November of 2022.

The Program is for you if:

- You want to explore business opportunities in health or food
- You would like to learn in a multicultural environment
- You see yourself in the mid-term starting a business

Who can participate in the Program?

The Youth Entrepreneurship Program is open to:

- Students enrolled in the current academic year in any of the High Education Institutions in the European Union, Serbia, Ukraine, or Turkey.
- Students with at least an English level equivalent to a B2 should be aware that the Program will be run in English.

Selection Criteria

The program will accept up to 130 students, and to make the selection, the organisation will consider the following criteria:

- Priority will be given to students of the High Education Institutions participating in the project, which are: University of Warsaw (Poland), Lodz University of Technology (Poland), Universidad Loyola (Spain), Marmara University (Turkey), Perrotis College (Greece), University of Kyiv (Ukraine), Medical University of Lodz (Poland), University of Agriculture in Krakow (Poland) and Slovak University of Agriculture in Nitra (Slovakia)
- Priority will be given to students enrolled in a field related to Food, Health and Business degrees.
- The selection committee will also consider a cohort balanced in gender.
- The spots in the Program will also be assigned taking balancing the number of students coming from different high education institutions.















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50 spots in the Program will be given to participants with the compromise of participating in the seven modules of the programme
